Thank you from Northampton Hope Centre

We would like to say a huge 'thank you to the congregation for your generosity in supporting our essential box and donating so many things for the homeless, as we go into the cold months these products will make such a difference . It's heart-warming that you thought of Hope and chose us as a charity that you wanted to benefit from your generosity. We are so fortunate to get support from people like you.

At the Hope centre we don't only offer crisis support but we also offer support to enable individuals to rebuild and lead fulfilling lives. To give you an idea of the sort of impact your donation will have, here's some insights into the work your support will enable:

 Daily Support: Our homeless centre serves on average between 50-60 people every day, providing essentials like hot meals, showers,



laundry facilities, haircuts, access to opening bank accounts, health services and many more support agencies. We continue to work with and get support from DWP, mental health charities, drug & alcohol misuse charities and WNC housing. It costs us approximately £1,000 a day to maintain all aspects of this vital provision

• Who we help: 95% of the people we see are male and are all ages, homelessness affects people from all walks of life. The biggest reasons for people becoming homeless is relationship breakdown and losing their house or rental through mortgage arrears or eviction

• Winter night shelter: Once again we will be providing a night shelter to enable some of our guests to sleep at night. We are hoping to cover the coldest Winter months and know that this will mean we save lives this Winter.

Your support will make a real difference to people in desperate need, helping us to continue to offer these crucial services. Thank you once again for your kindness and support.

A crate is located in the Sidespersons corner for any donations, which Jim Mercer kindly brings to St Albans.



Advent and Christmas Charity: Save the Children and Eve







They also help children in poverty in the UK with housing, education while there are 4.5 million children in poverty in the UK. News from Abington Park View

On Wednesday 12th November, Revd Helen, Liz, and Jackie led a service of Remembrance for the residents. We shared memories of family members who had lived through during WW2. Some of us spoke about fathers who had been in the armed forces and others remembered family members who had been in reserved occupations. These included menfolk who had worked down the coalmines and women who served in the Land Army on farms. Others had mothers who worked in munition factories or who drove ambulances. We thought about Air Raid Wardens and members of the Home



Guard. The common factor for all those we remembered was that they were ordinary people doing extraordinary jobs!

Our second visit of the month was on 26th November when we held our annual service to remember the residents who had died during the last year. This was a moving and uplifting service during which a candle was lit as each person's name was read out.



We hope it has given the staff and residents a proper chance to say goodbye. As Christians,

the Resurrection of Jesus gives us hope that we will meet our loved ones again, and in the meantime, we believe they are safe with him.

On 10th December we shall be holding a Messy Vintage Service on the theme of Advent and we shall be making simple Advent Wreaths similar to this one. If you would like to come and help, please contact Liz Kelly.

Our final visit of the year will be for the Carol Service on 17th December.
