#### **Rector's Pastoral Letter**

A few weeks ago, Liz, our Ana Chaplain, and I had the pleasure of visiting our friend, Jan Patterson who lives on Billing Road in the parish.

Liz and I both got to know Jan through our Thursday morning service. She used to worship regularly in Abington on Sundays. But after her dear husband, John's death, Jan's sons often would visit her and take her out on Sundays which made her naturally settled in the Thursday congregation.

"She really appreciated the opportunity to worship on Thursdays. She would always help with the washing afterwards, saying that was all she could do to help." says Liz.



As the world got hit by the Pandemic, Jan's mobility also got deteriorated. She is no longer able to walk to the church without an assistance. So the church now comes to her every month with holy communion which she deeply appreciates.

"Do you know what I also appreciate?" asks Jan. "The monthly newsletter! I read every single article in it. It's so nice to be included in this way and to hear all the wonderful things that are happening around the church and the parish.

Both the communion and newsletter make me feel connected to the church. Please do thank all those who contribute to this for me." Then she brings a shoebox filled with little Christmas Stockings that can go on Christmas trees. All hand sewn by Jan.

"It's all I can offer. I am 96." says Jan as she hands the shoebox over to Liz. "I was hoping these can be of any use for raising funds for our Christmas Charities."

I am deeply touched by her kind gesture. She is 96. She can't walk without help from others. And yet she still thinks about helping others and supporting the community she loves. Looking at Jan and her stockings reminds me of the last verse of the Christmas hymn, In the Bleak Midwinter.

What can I give him, poor as I am?
If I were a shepherd,
I would bring a lamb,
if I were a wise man
I would do my part,
yet what I can I give him,
give my heart.

For Jan, it's her hand sewn stockings. And I am sure baby Jesus would smile to her, offering his most gentle and tender love for her. I wonder, what do I have to offer?

December can be so busy that we often just barely keep up with the things in our to-do list before Christmas. But what is Christmas about? It's about Christ and His invitation for us to meet Him. And the Bible tells us that he is to be found not in a palace, not in a fancy audience room but at a back door (as Bishop Andrew said at the confirmation service), at a messy stable, in a manger. And He wants us to know what matters to Him the most. It's not how presentable we are or how successful we are, how strong we are. He simply wants us to let Him love us wherever we are. If we can let Him love us then He can turn the messiest stable and grossest manger into the holiest place where we meet with God himself.

On Thursday 26th October we took 11 young people from the church, including three Guides, to Tenpin Bowling for an afternoon of fun and food! Last year we took three young people, so this year there was definitely more competition for those bowling! The top players were Liam Menzies and Olly Tallack! Thank you to Revd. Tracy for organising this event.

The children and young people in the church and those attending Little Fishes have been given Advent calendars to enjoy in the weeks up to Christmas. The calendars include a book about the Story of Christmas, as well as puzzles, challenges and chocolate!

As I write this we are looking forward to the Christmas services, especially the Christingle service on Sunday 10th December at 3 pm. # **News from Abington Park View Care Home**

On 1st November, Revd Jun celebrated Holy Communion for All Saints Day, accompanied by Jackie and Liz. Thirteen residents joined us in the garden lounge, and we took communion to three residents in their rooms.

Then on 15th November, the team of Janice, Kate and Liz held a Remembrance Service. Several residents shared their memories of being children in the Second World War and spoke about rationing, relatives who served in the Armed Forces, and seeing the orange glow over Coventry when it was bombed in 1940. Janet told us about her father who found a cross in the bombed-out cathedral, took it home and then years later returned it, having kept it safe

until then. We also talked about the bravery of conscientious objectors who served as ambulance drivers and stretcher bearers in the First World War.

There is a Messy Vintage Service on 6th December with a Christmas theme. We shall think about the story of the wise men coming from the East to worship baby Jesus and we shall make bright stars like this one.



The last visit of the year will be for the Carol Service on 20th December. This is always a most enjoyable occasion and the residents enjoy singing many of their favourite carols and hearing the message of the Christmas story once again.
