# **Curate's letter**

As I write this, I am aware of an important email landing in my inbox outlining the process of assessment for the end of my first year of curacy. We were warned back in September that this would come around quickly, and they weren't wrong!

So I find myself at a point of reflecting backwards and forwards. So much has happened during my first year of ordained ministry. I have found myself being warmly welcomed and encouraged by a truly loving church family (you!) and have been growing into the role of liturgical deacon during our Sunday worship. Being with you through Advent and Christmas was lovely, and I especially enjoyed the Christmas Eve nativity play. I am also looking forward to my first Lenten journey in the parish, and experiencing Easter with you, which I am sure will be here in no time at all.

A key area of my training during this first year of curacy has been funeral ministry. Like all curates, it is important to learn how the process of cremation and burial happens, and to experience being alongside those who are deeply grieving. The Church of England's funeral service is a wonderful framework allowing people to say goodbye and entrust their loved one to God's eternal care whilst making room for personal expression. I have had the privilege to minister to local people, some of whom have deep connections to Abington, and the death of the late Queen Elizabeth provided a unique opportunity to reflect on the role of the church within the mourning of a nation.

I have also enjoyed working with our local schools, both in supporting the work of Sharing God's Gifts, providing assemblies and welcoming the children into the church over Christmas (Covid permitting!) The response from our local schools has been wonderful and they are very keen to develop the link with the church and to make the most of what we can bring to enrich their religious education curriculum. I am looking forward to visiting Bridgewater School again in the run up to Easter, where we will be sharing and exploring the Easter story with the children.

Looking forward, my training moves onto weddings and we are blessed to have a few coming up. Jun is very generous in providing lots of opportunities to learn from him, as well as encouraging me to learn independently. This is another important area of ministry and I know that Church of England research shows just how many people the Church reaches through attendance at weddings, so they provide important missional opportunities and it matters that they are done well. I have lots to learn but I am very excited to be moving into this area.

The other big part of the forthcoming year is my ordination as Priest, due to take place on June 25<sup>th</sup> and there will be more to say about that as the time draws nearer, but I am already wondering how it will feel to preside at the Eucharist for the first time. It is a great comfort to know that I am amongst such loving and caring people here in Abington and I know that I can depend on you for prayer and encouragement as ordination approaches – thank you!

In the meantime, my curate's portfolio is due mid-March, which is a collection of reflections, journals, feedback and an essay, and is provided to the Bishop ahead of his decision to ordain me. Whilst I am sad the Bishop Donald, who has been so important in my journey so far, will not be here to ordain me, it is a joy that Bishop John will. So far, Bishop John has overseen my training as a Children's Minister, a Lay Pastoral Minister and has ordained me as Deacon, so it is rather nice that he will be there at this next step.

So please remember me and the other Deacons preparing for ordination as Priests this summer, and I do hope that many of you will join me at the Cathedral or online – details to follow.

# Bishop's Bible Day 2023

The Bishop's Bible Day is day for everyone to explore the Bible together. All are welcome. Why not invite your whole Church.

For many people the psalms are amongst their favourite bible passages and this day gives us an opportunity to find out more about two special psalms. Come and discover what it means to sing The Lord is my Shepherd.

We're thrilled that our speaker this year is one of the most exciting speakers in the country, The Revd Dr Isabelle Hamley. She is a former Chaplain to the Archbishop of Canterbury and the author of last year's popular and accessible Lent Book "Embracing Justice", and currently Theological Adviser to the House of Bishops. Isabelle will give the two keynote addresses. One on the Shepherd's, Psalm 23" and the other on Psalm 137 "By the rivers of Babylon", made famous by Boney M! There will also be a range of practical and interactive workshops. Before you go home, there is even an opportunity to ask Isabelle questions and grill the bishop.

We are delighted that this year we are able to offer you not only hot drinks throughout the day, but also a cold lunch. We would ask that you make what contribution you can towards the cost of this, and the day as a whole, when you book. The cost to the diocese is approximately £20 per person, but we do not expect you to pay this much, unless you wish.
