48/25 TREASURERS REPORT

The financial update report was circulated by Susie ahead of the meeting. We are generally tracking in line with expectations. We have set up with a new energy supplier which will save money. If we had continued with the parish buying scheme, our costs would have doubled. We are changing our bank account to a charity account. Electronic payments are preferred in the future as cash and cheque deposits incur fees.

Susie will begin to prepare the 2026 budgets ready for review at the next PCC.

We are thankful to Cathy for supporting someone who came to us in need via the Tree of Hope.

Melissa proposed two activities to run to the end of December. One is a build and decorate your own money box and emergency pack collections. Both activities were supported.

52/25 CHURCHYARD ART PROJECT

The Tree of Hope will conclude on the 5th October and from here the tree will be transferred to Parklands Primary school. Jun has spoken with Bob (Barn Art Installations), who was behind the design and construction of the Tree and he is willing to help with our next project. Jun proposes we work next year with Action for Happiness. Dr David Smart, who is a member of our congregation is a leader of the Northampton Branch. One of the themes we hope to introduce to our sermon series next year is wellbeing and mental health and this could join up with the churchyard art project. This ties into the fourth of our key words of feeding, community, person and space.

53/25 LIVING IN LOVE AND FAITH

Feedback was invited from the PCC. Numbers signing up will be checked. It was confirmed that refreshments (tea/coffee) will be available at the sessions. Dianne and Sandra offered to manage refreshments. The sessions will create a safe space to contribute to the discussion. If anyone knows of anyone who has any concerns or doubts, reassurance can be provided that this is not about big changes or trying to change people's views, it is about finding Christ in all people so that we can bring all people to Christ. We pray for a good response, and we will encourage as many people to take part as possible. We hope for an enriching and encouraging conversation. God never said 'agree with each other', He said 'love each other'. We will pray for the church and for Jun as he leads us through this discussion.

54/25 BUILDING WORK REPORT

South path – the work is complete and has been paid for. Thank you to Donald and Bob for all their work in bringing the path work to a conclusion. It was suggested a formal opening of the path be arranged.

Ladies toilet in the Church Rooms – a donor is prepared to pay for redecoration and replacement of the basins, the WC pans and the mirrors.

Floor condition in the Church Rooms – woodworm treatment in the small hall is being arranged. Woodworm has also been found in the guides cupboard. The old wooden tables that are used for the fete will also need to be disposed of as they also have woodworm. Replacements will need to be found in time for the next fete.

Quinquennial Update – work has started but all required work is unlikely to be complete this year.
